Fraser Island, the world's largest sand island, has officially been renamed to its traditional name K'gari (pronounced GAR-ree). The **paradise** island, off the coast of Queensland, Australia, is a popular tourist spot. It is also the home of the Butchulla, the **indigenous** Australians who have made the island their **settlement** for about 60,000 to 70,000 years. With the restoration of its true name by the government comes **adjustments** to maps and road signs, but the change has greater **symbolism** to the Butchulla people than that. Their language and cultural coordinator said, "K'gari means to me, home. Home amongst my people, the descendants". K'gari was where, in the 1830s, British captain James Fraser was shipwrecked with his wife Eliza Fraser and their crew. James and his crew died, but after Eliza was later rescued the **landmark** became known as Fraser Island. In 1992 UNESCO saw the island's significance and listed it as a heritage site. K'gari is quite **distinctive**. It has no roads, around 100 freshwater lakes, and the **phenomenon** of having the world's only rainforest on sand. The **campaign** to have the island renamed has taken many years, but in 2021 the idea was embraced more seriously by the Australian government. In 2022 a public consultation was held and 70% of the **submissions** received were in favour of the change. The event was marked with a ceremony and an island elder said they hope the change brings inspiration to other people.
